- 6. What do you believe are the largest issues facing you, as you strive to comply with the BMAP?
- 7. How will BMAPs impact your business?
- 8. How do you plan to deal with the impacts the BMAP has or will have on your business?
- 9. Do you think strengthening water quality control through monitoring TMDLs and following BMAPs will assist with consumer confidence in agricultural products? Why?
