- 6. Do you take care of your home landscape/lawn? If so, how will TMDLs impact your landscaping care?
- 7. What do you believe are the largest issues facing you, as you strive to comply with TMDLs as a homeowner who needs to take care of your landscape/lawn?
- 8. If you have a landscape/lawn to take care of, how do you plan to deal with the impacts TMDLs have or will have on your landscaping care?
- 9. Do you think strengthening water quality control through monitoring TMDLs will make you more confident with local agricultural products? Why?
