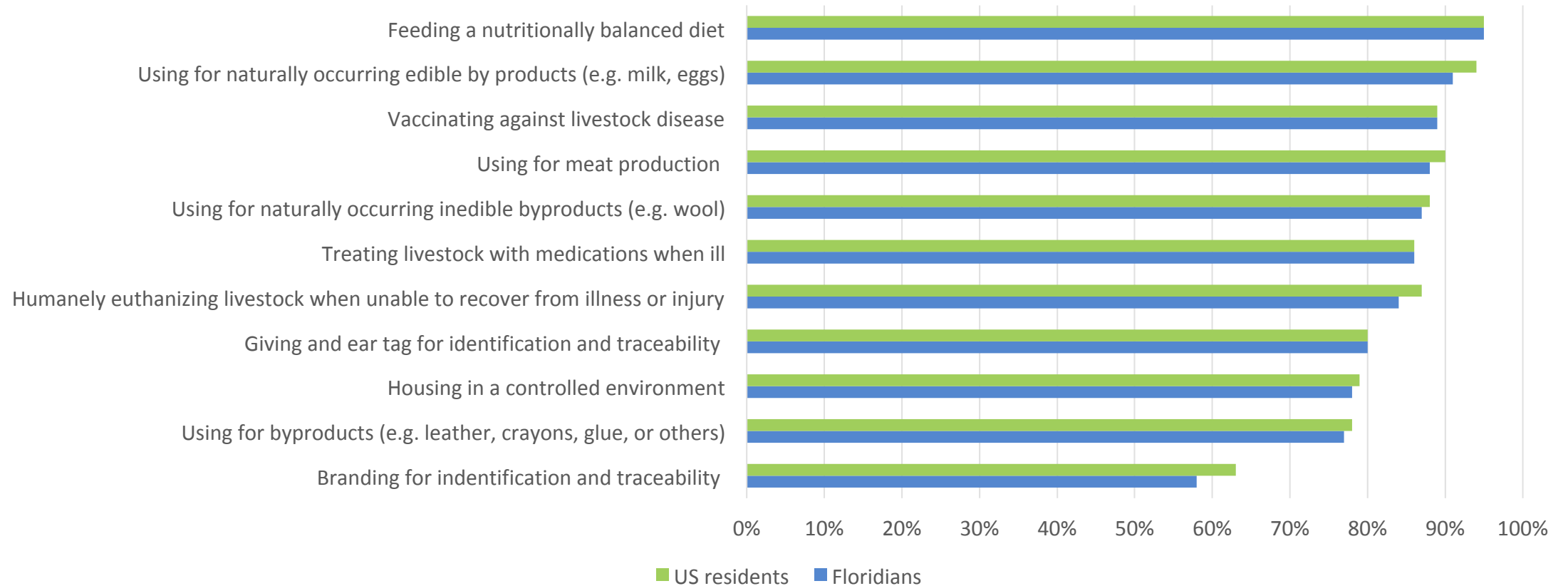


Our Research Methods

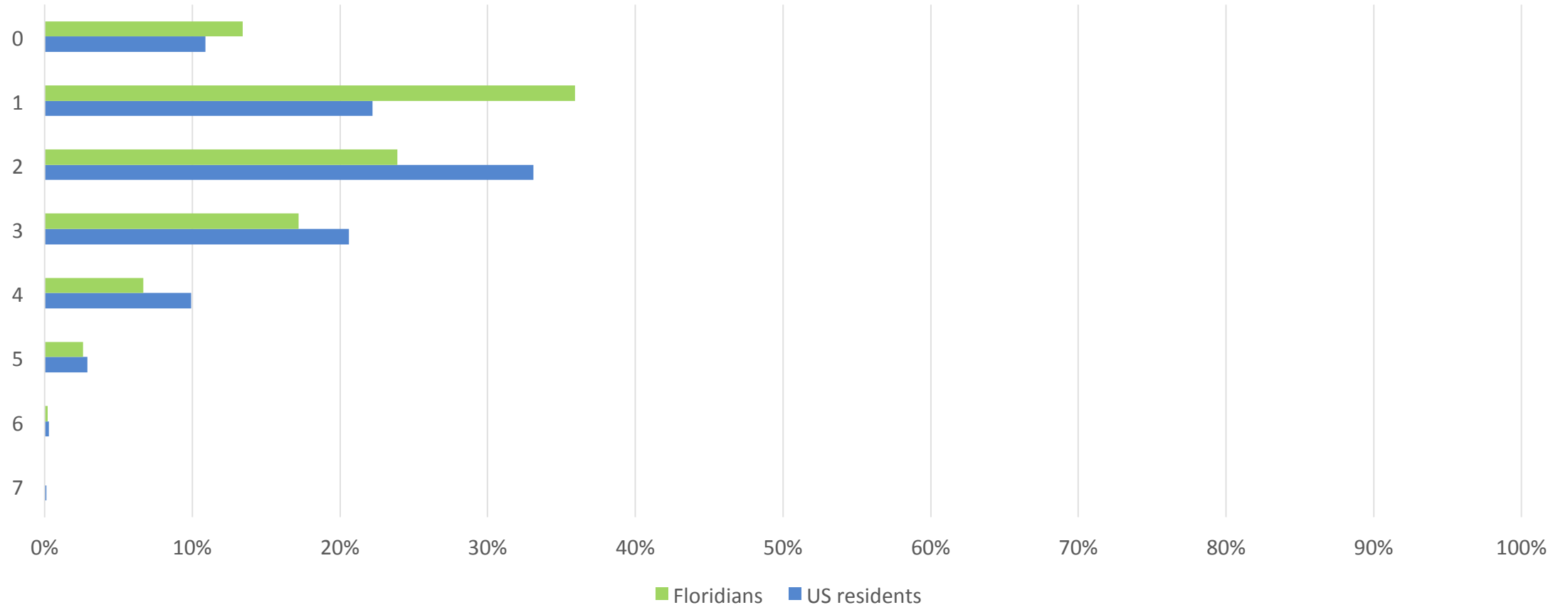
- Non-probability opt-in techniques
- Collaborate with a public opinion polling company to obtain responses
 - Florida residents
 - US residents
- Use weighting techniques to ensure responses align with US census data
 - Age
 - Gender
 - Race & Ethnicity
 - Geographic location (FL)



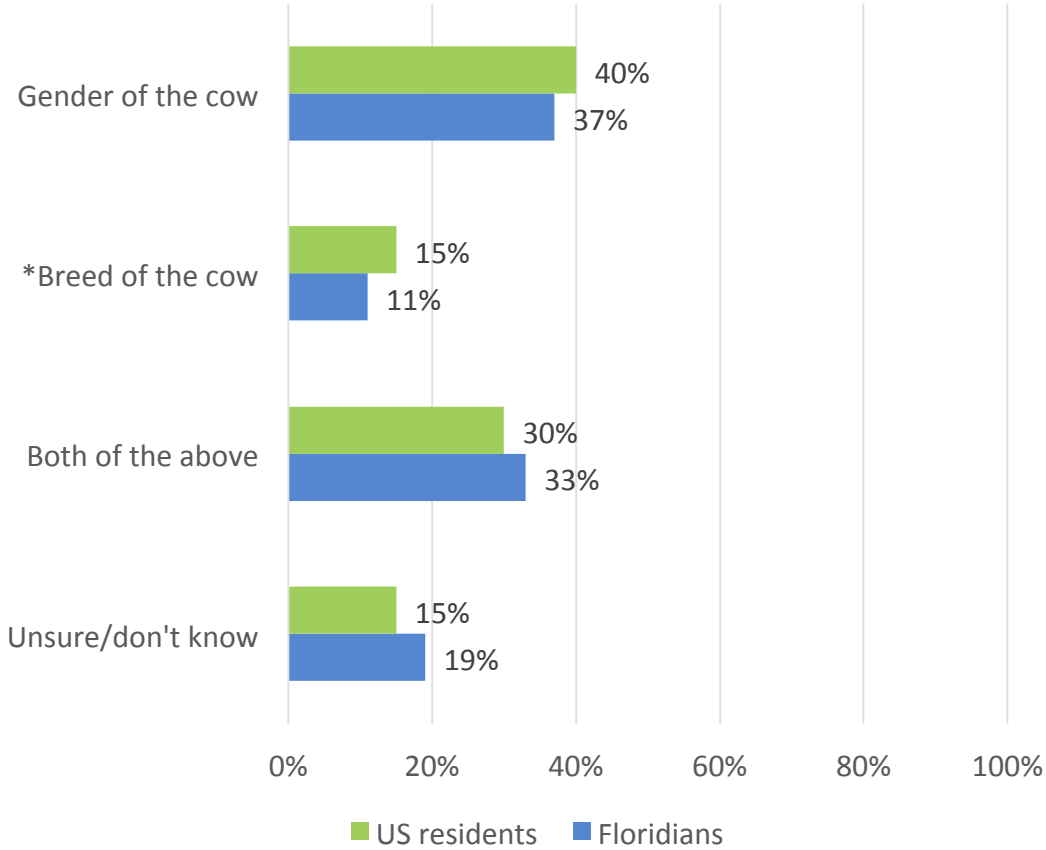
Favorability toward livestock practices



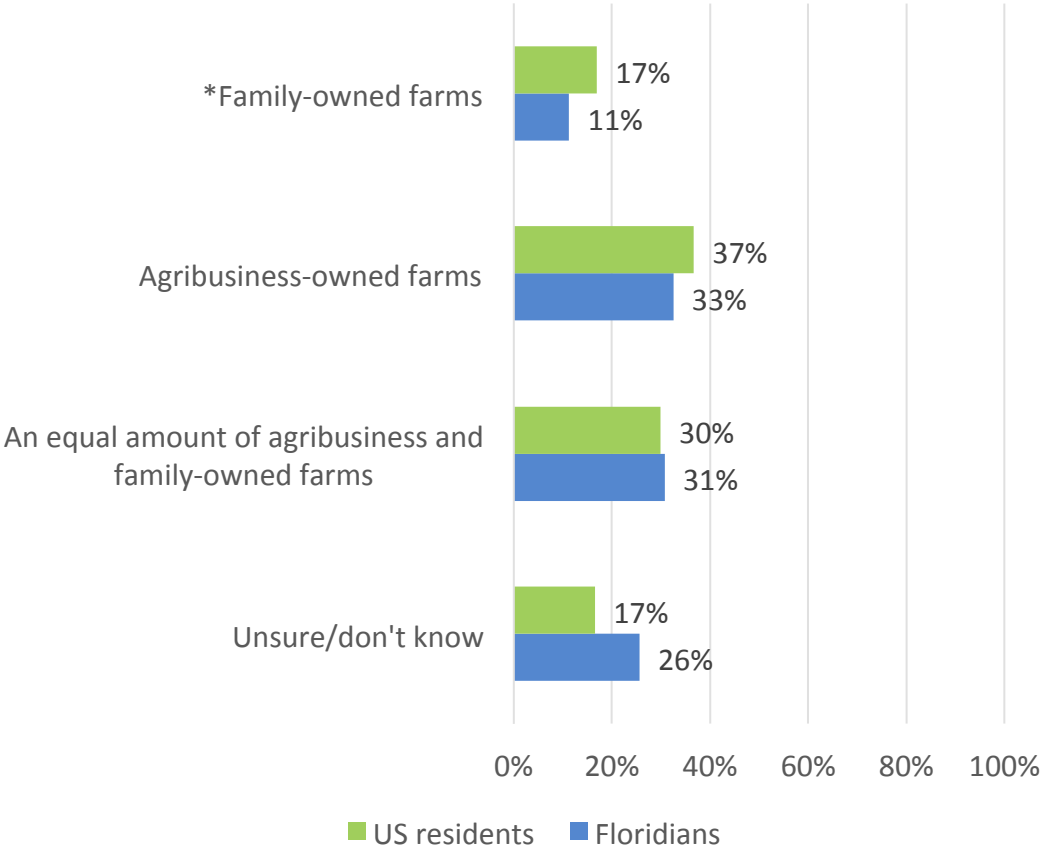
Knowledge of livestock care and use



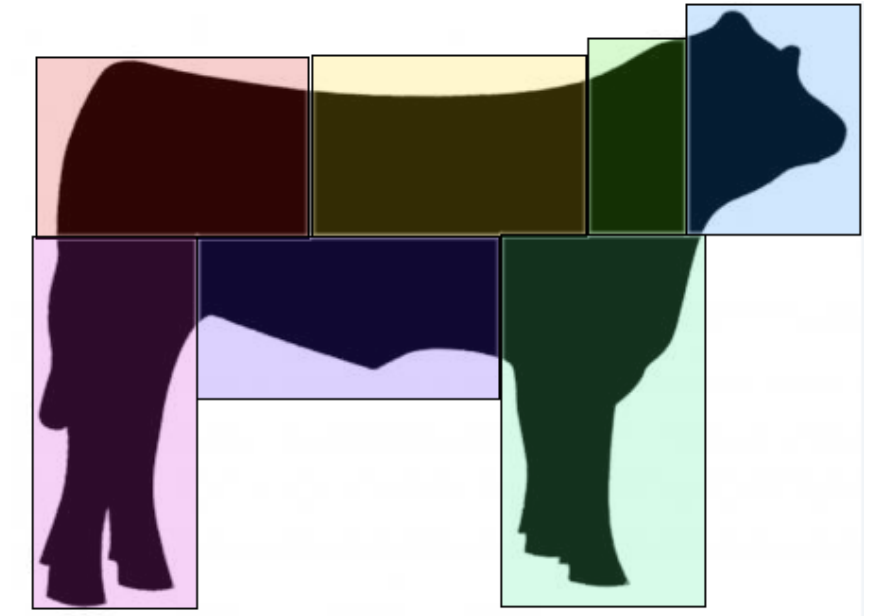
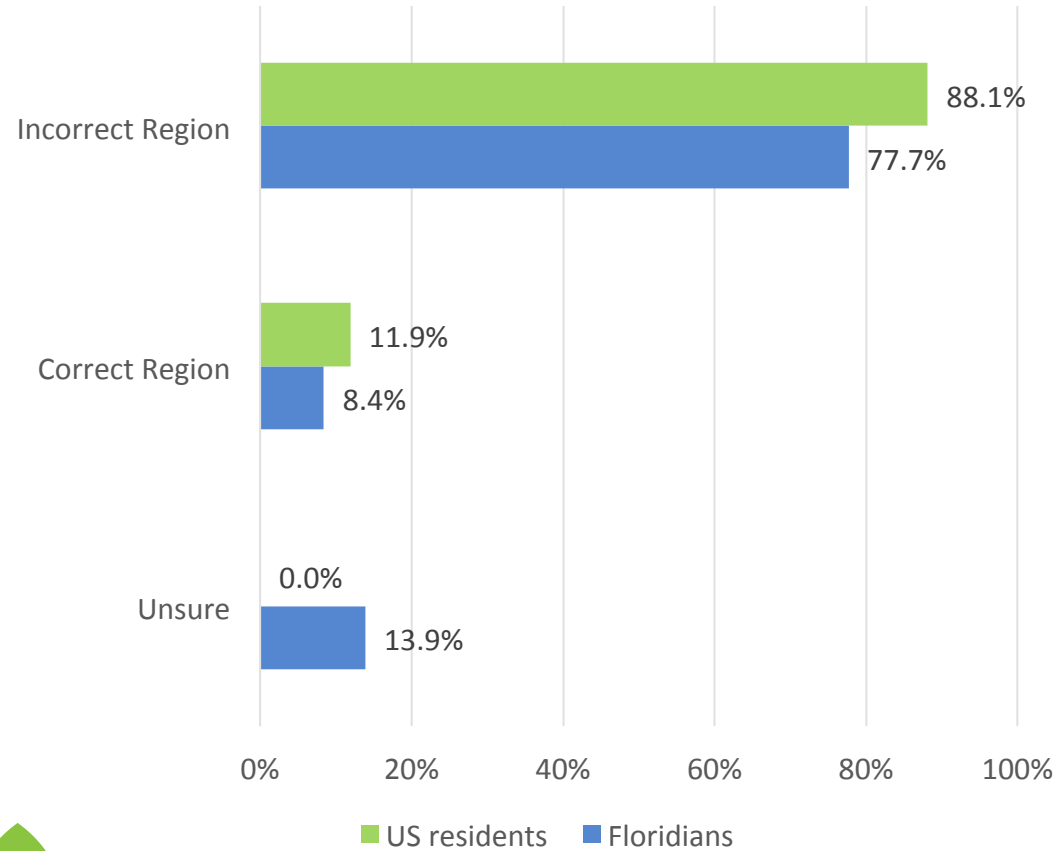
What dictates whether a cow will have horns?



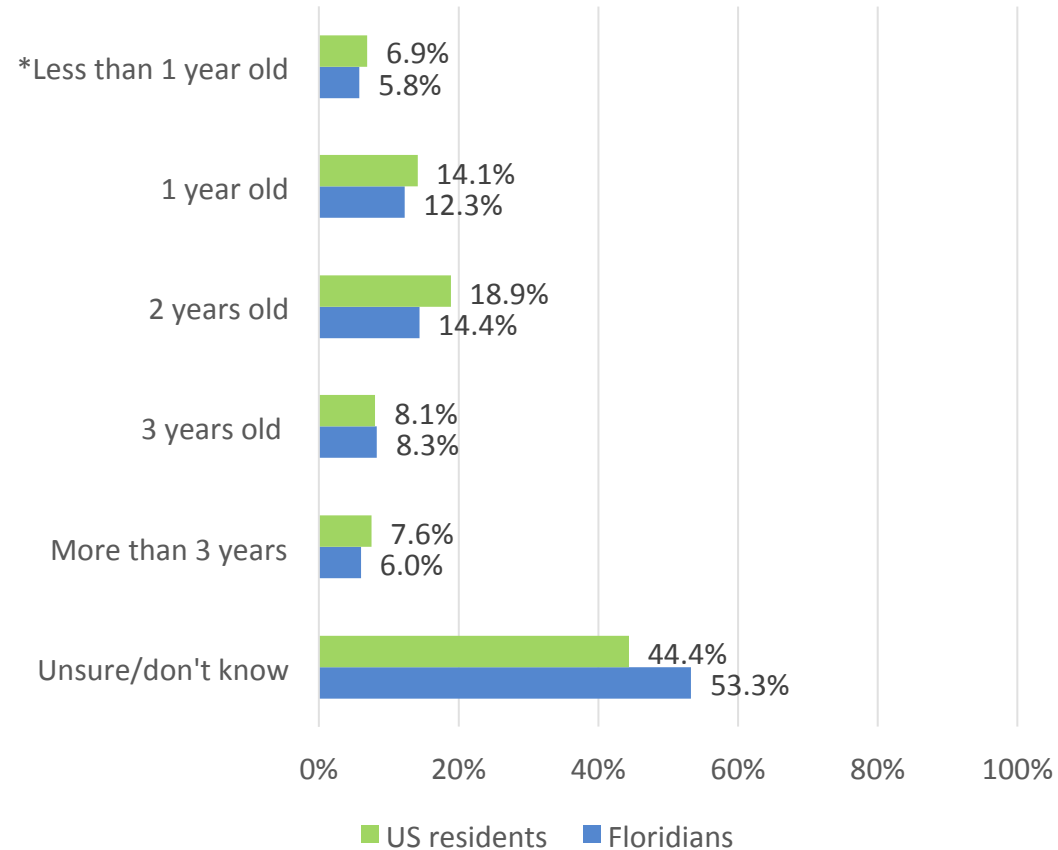
The majority of animals raised for human consumption in the US are raised on...



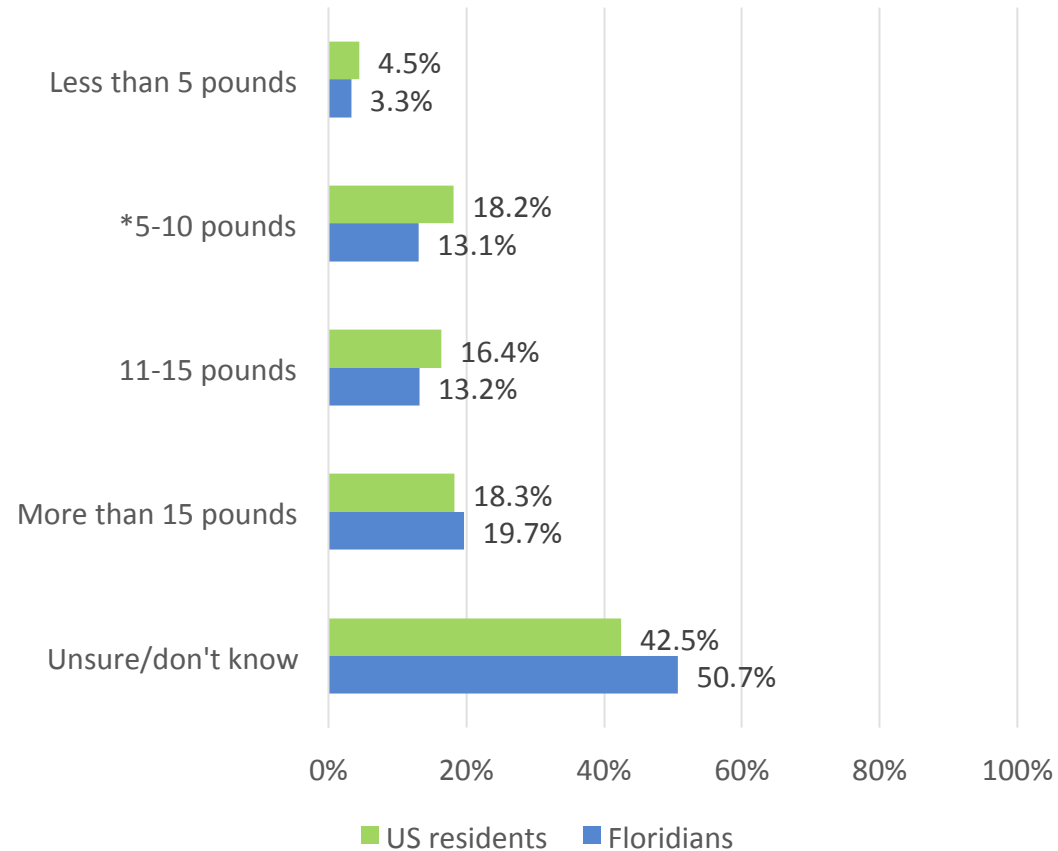
Vaccines for disease prevention and the administration of medicine to treat illness are often given to livestock in shot form. Please click on the recommended injection site.



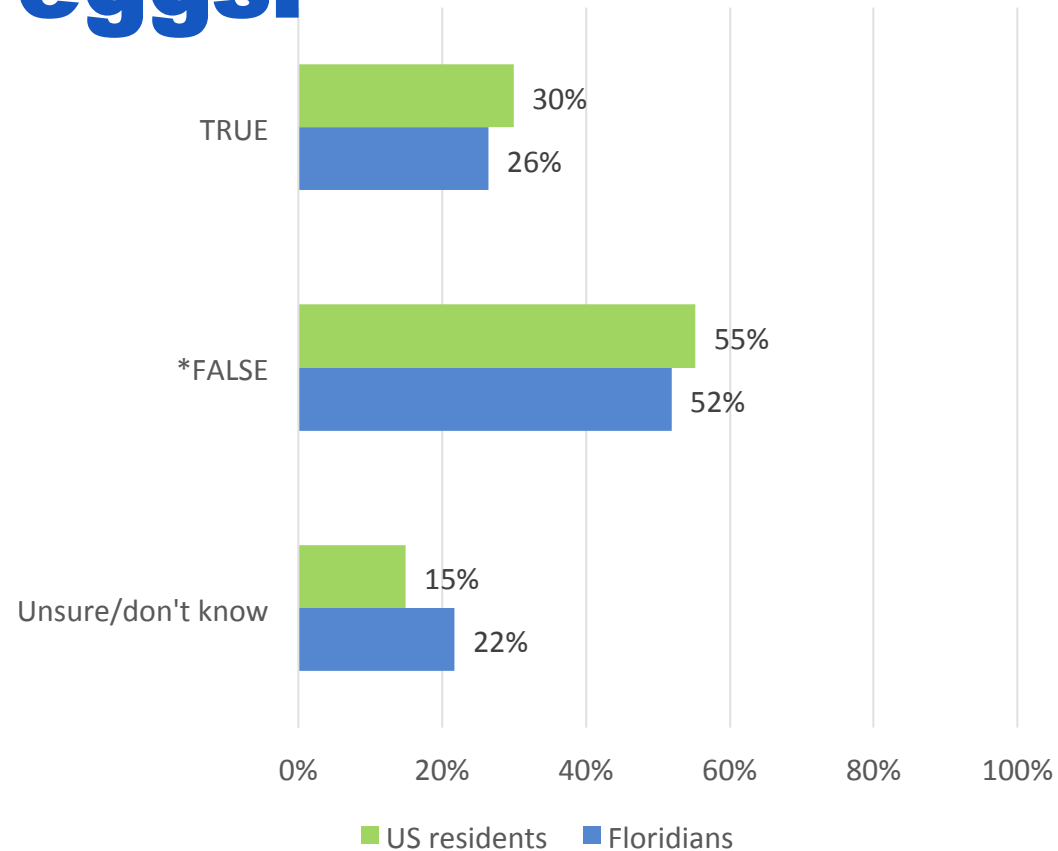
Pigs are typically how old when they go to slaughter?



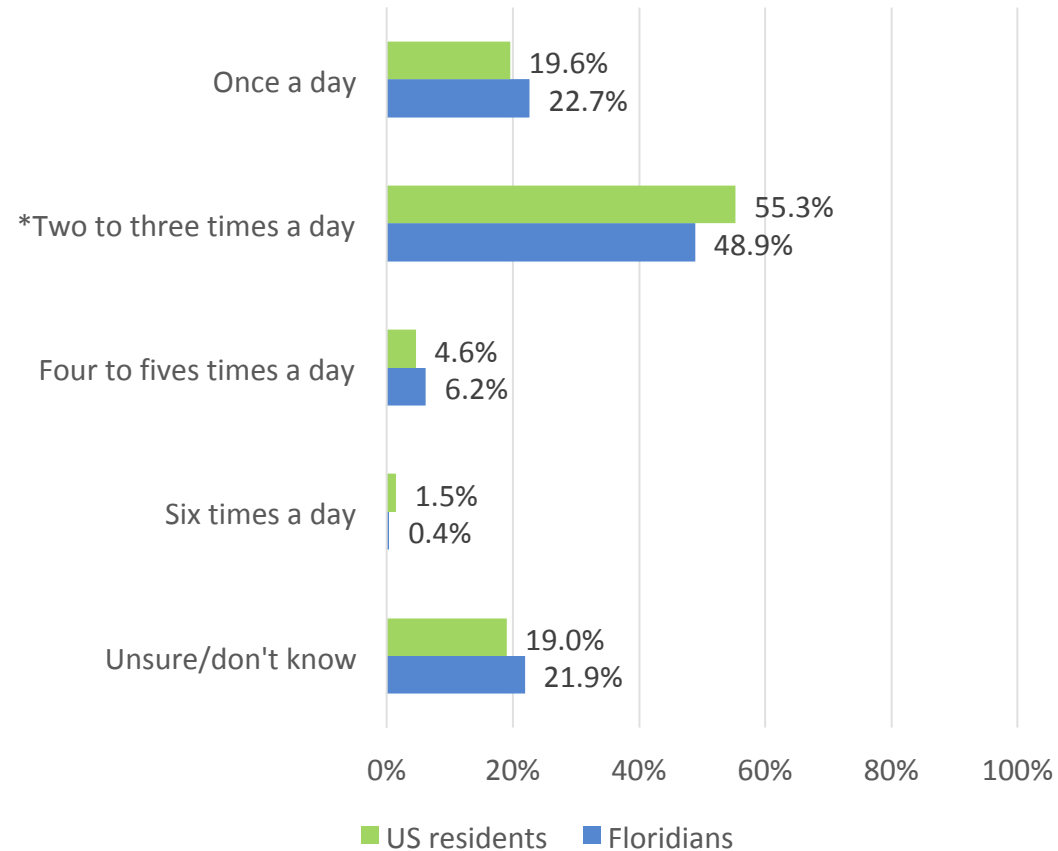
On average, how many pounds of wool does one sheep produce each year?



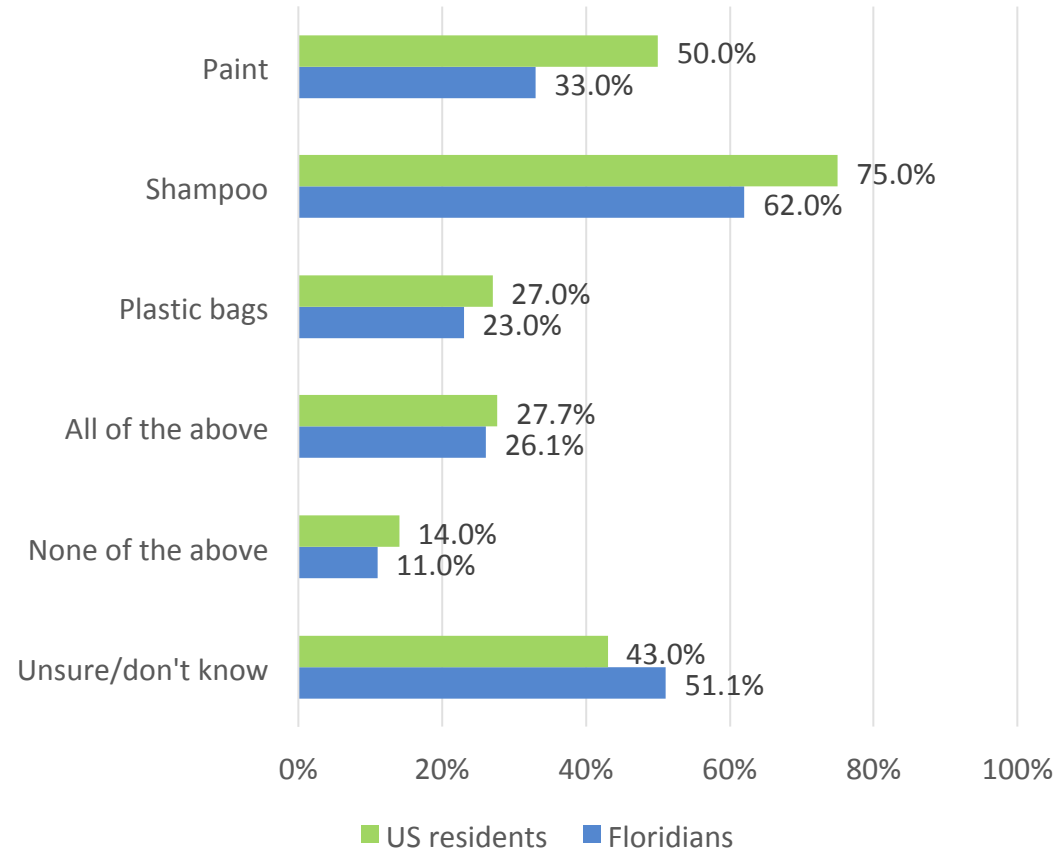
Roosters (male chickens) must be present for hens (female chickens) to lay eggs.

By products from pigs play a vital, though less visible, role in maintaining and improving the quality of human life.

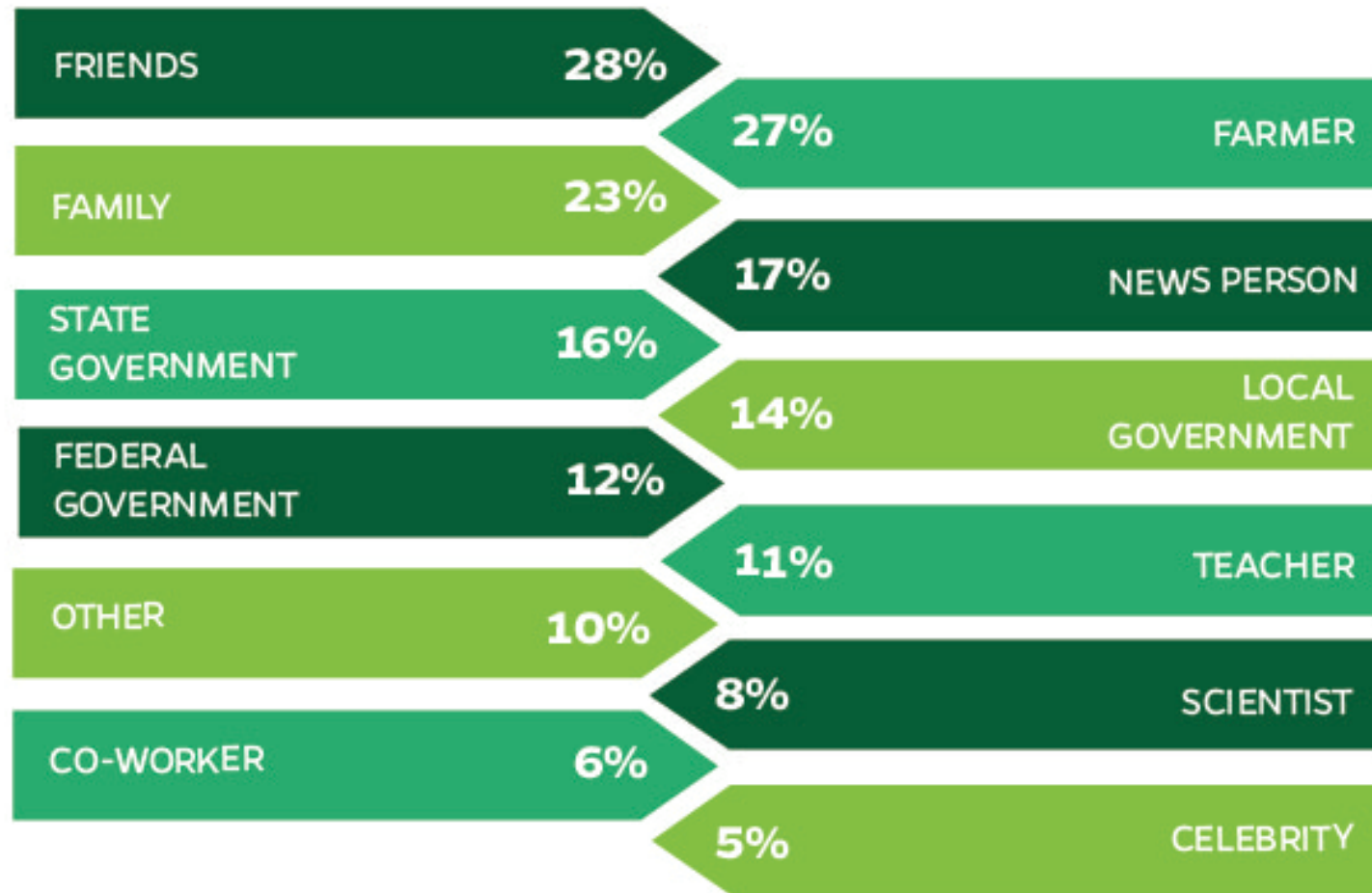
- Phonograph records

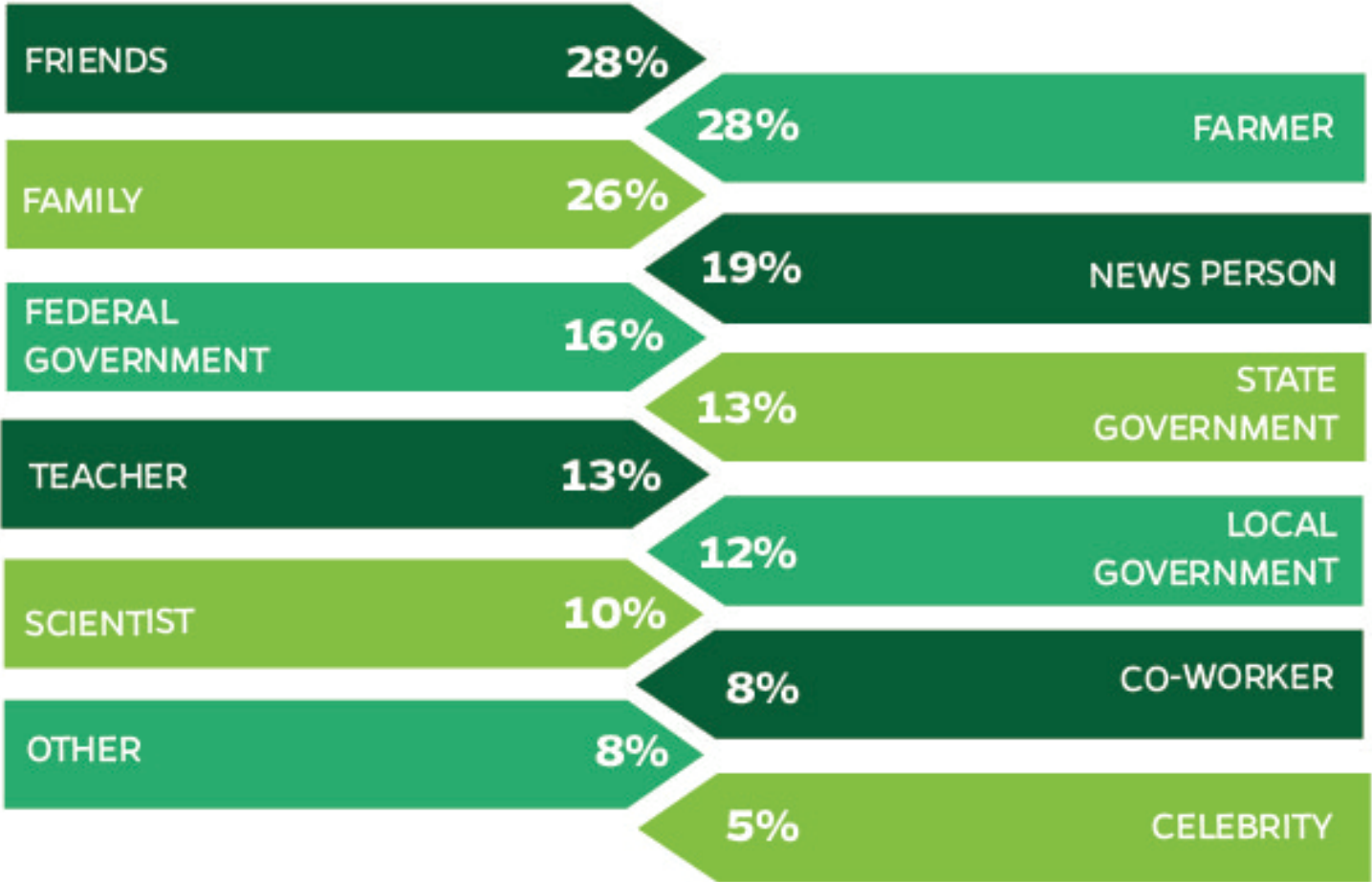
